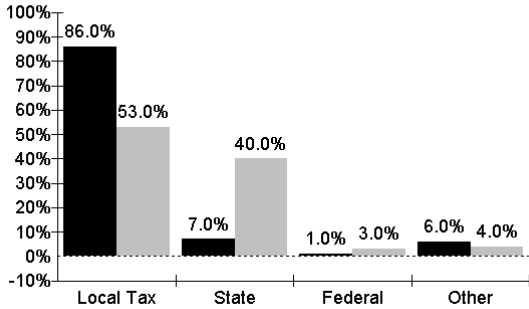

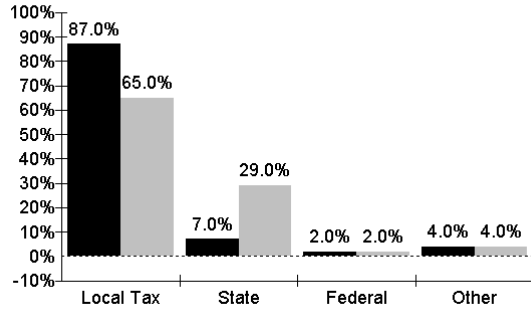
Percents of total revenues from various sources for 1997 - 98, 1998 - 99, 1999 - 00, 2000 - 01, and 2001 - 02.

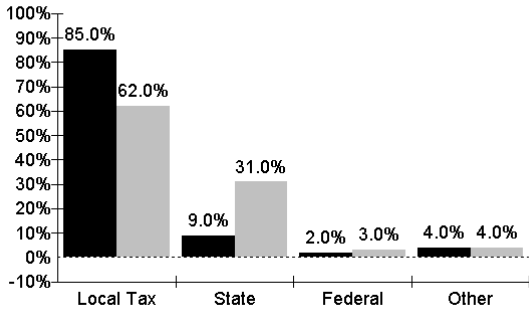
1997 - 98 Actual



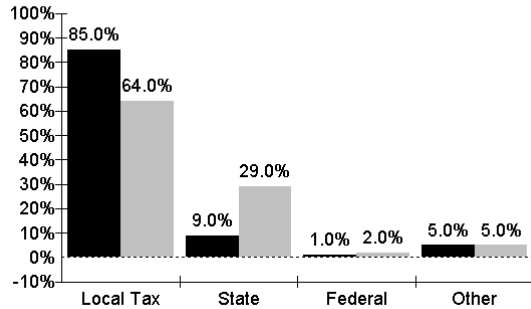
1998 - 99 Actual



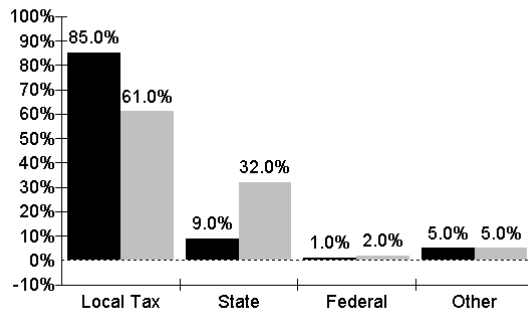
1999 - 00 Actual
